Homestead had a well drilled, which supplied water to the homestead, 2 stock ponds (1 measuring about 50 ft by 50 ft and 6 ft deep, the other one is about 70 feet long 3 ft deep and 15 feet wide see Exhibit B). 3. 80 acres cleared downslope of the homestead that was farmed, (see Exhibit B.) 4. Well was drilled in the 1930's. New Mexico Water Engineers office has it classified as an agricultural well and state the date of the well had to be prior to 1956 when records were being kept. 5. 320 acres with 64 animal Cow-calf pairs using about 40 gallons of water per day/pair would need 2,640 gallons per day or 867,600 gallons per year for survival not to mention the water use on the homestead itself when we re-build the house. 6. Old timers in the area, state the well had some of the best water in the region and families came from all over to fill their water containers for house cisterns. 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


WHEREAS, a certificate of the Register of the Land Office of Santa Fe, New Mexico, has been deposited in  
the General Land Office, whereby it appears that, pursuant to the Act of Congress of May 20, 1902, "To Encourage  
Settlements to Actual Settlers on the Public Domain," and the acts supplemental thereto, the claim of Tom H.  
Will, has been established and duly compensated, in conformity to law, for the lots one, two, three and four,  
in said half of the west half and the east half of Section thirty-one in Township five north of Range seven  
west of the East Meridian, New Mexico, containing six hundred thirty-eight acres and sixty-four  
square rods of land, according to the Official Plan of the Survey of the said land, as file in the General  
Land Office;


